

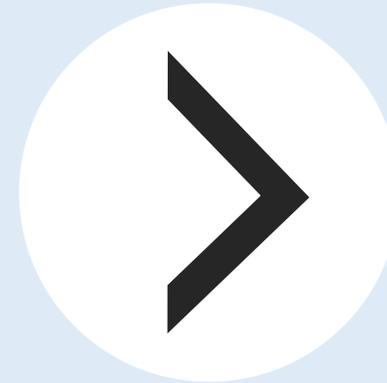



GOALS



HUMAN RIGHTS

Improve living conditions for migrant workers. Fruits and vegetables: Focus on migrant workers' living conditions in Europe.

Improve living conditions for small farmers. Rice: Small farmers' right to humane conditions due to high seed costs

Ensure the right to health (focus chicken production)

LABOR RIGHTS

Improve working conditions for migrant workers with a focus on modern slavery. Fruits and vegetables, meat and colonial products: The action plan will focus on systematic abuse of workers in production.

Ensure there is no child labor in the chicken industry.

Improve supplier routines: Focus on internal processes and routines with Swedish suppliers to ensure compliance in the supply chain.

ENVIRONMENT

Reduce improper use of antibiotics

ANTI-CORRUPTION

Review risk of corruption in high-risk countries (fish, fruit, meat): develop risk categories for anti-corruption



ACTIVITY FOCUS

Year 1

Focus on desktop audits of locally and nationally prioritized suppliers as well as industry dialogues.

Year 2

Focus on desktop audits of locally and nationally prioritized suppliers as well as industry dialogues.
Factory audit of chicken production in collaboration with Hållbarhetskollen.

Year 3

Focus on-site audits of fruits & vegetables. Explore risk of overuse of antibiotics. Deviation management of previously conducted desktop audits.
